Welcome to the 5th edition of the Chelmsford North-East Bypass (CNEB) advanced works newsletter, produced by Octavius Infrastructure, working for Essex County Council.

Our works involve building a new multi-modal bridge which will allow the continued operation of an existing mineral quarry during construction and operation of the Chelmsford North-East Bypass. In the future, it will help connect communities.

We are still making good progress and are on schedule to deliver the project as planned.

Important news

There is not expected to be any traffic disruption in the local area due to the advanced works because the majority of site works are taking place off the road network.

There will be **no** road or lane closures as part of the construction of the bridge.

What has been happening so far?

- Bridge beams placed.
- Remainder of wing walls being constructed.
- Earthworks approach roads continue to be constructed.
- Centre of bridge deck steel fixing complete and concrete poured.









Site news

The centre of the bridge is now in place after the steel beams were lifted into place. The concrete has also been poured. It is now looking much more like a bridge!









Sustainability and social value news

We measure our social value impact using Thrive – a calculation software tool. The value is calculated using Essex County Council TOMs (Themes, Outcomes and Measures) framework, which is fully aligned to the Government Social Value Model.

Year 11 students from Chelmer Valley High School enjoy site visits

- Upper wing walls will be poured and completed.
- Remaining parts of the bridge deck will be poured and completed.
- Backfill to the abutments.
- Finishing embankment fill.
