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Hello





We (Essex County Council) want to tell you about our plans to improve the Army and Navy junction in Chelmsford.



A junction is where two or more roads join together.



The Army and Navy junction is a very important way in and out of Chelmsford.



We have been looking at ways we could make the junction work better for everyone. Now we are asking people what they think about those plans. This process is called consultation.

Background



The Army and Navy junction is already very busy and people often get stuck in traffic.



There used to be a flyover (like a bridge) over the road to help with traffic, but it had to be taken down because it was not safe any more.

A new flyover would make traffic problems worse in the city centre.



We need more people to walk, cycle or use the bus instead of using their cars. These ways of travelling are sometimes called sustainable transport because they have a lower impact on the environment.



If more people travel in these ways it will reduce traffic on the roads, help the environment and make us all healthier.



That is why we are trying to make the junction better for everyone – people walking, cycling and using buses, as well as cars. This is what we mean by the Sustainable Transport Package.

Objectives



We have a list of things we would like to make better at the junction. These are called objectives.

We want to:



- Make walking and cycling safer and easier
- Make bus journeys quicker and more reliable
- Help people feel safer when they are travelling on our roads
- Make it easier to travel between different places
- Make the junction look more attractive
- · Make car journeys more reliable
- Protect the environment

Options



After deciding what we wanted to make better, we looked at ways we could do this.



To start with we had lots of ideas.




We worked hard to decide which ones would work best until we were left with the five best options.



We then looked in detail to see how the options would affect things like how long it would take those walking, cycling or driving to travel across the junction.



We also looked at the impacts on the environment and the number of people using Park and Ride – a place where people park their cars outside the city and take the bus for the rest of their journey.



As a result, we now have two options to help improve journeys for everyone.


Hamburger Roundabout Option



A Hamburger Roundabout allows the main road to pass through the middle while other routes go around.



Therefore, it looks a bit like a hamburger.



The main road would run between Parkway and Essex Yeomanry Way - the direction most traffic travels at the busiest times.



The roundabout would be used to travel to and from other roads at the junction, such as Chelmer Road, Baddow Road and Van Diemans Road.



Traffic lights would safely control traffic using the roundabout.



There would be separate footpaths and cycle lanes at the junction, instead of the subway which is there at the moment.

Separate T-Junctions Option



A T-Junction is a way of connecting two or more roads. As the name suggests, the junction is shaped like a letter T.



We would create two new T-Junctions
- one linking Chelmer Road and Essex
Yeomanry Way; the other linking
Essex Yeomanry Way/Parkway and
Van Diemans Road/Baddow Road.




Traffic lights would safely control traffic using the junctions.



There would also be new separate footpaths and cycle lanes at the junction. Again, these would be instead of the subway which is there at the moment.

Which option would be better?



We want your help to decide which option (Hamburger Roundabout or Separate T-Junctions) we should choose. Here is some information to help you decide which you prefer.

Hamburger Roundabout



Cycling through the junction would be about 35% quicker at the busiest times.



Walking through the junction at ground level would be about 11% quicker. Average walking times would be similar to those where the subway is currently used.



Bus journeys through the junction would be about 24% faster at the busiest times.



Car journeys through the junction would be about 49% quicker at the busiest times.

Which option would be better?

Separate T-Junctions



Cycling through the junction would be about 22% quicker at the busiest times.



Walking through the junction at ground level would be about 4% quicker. Average walking times would be slightly slower compared to those where the subway is currently used.




Bus journeys through the junction would be slightly faster (0.2%) at the busiest times.



Car journeys through the junction would be about 7% quicker at the busiest times.

Walking and cycling



We want to make the area around the junction safer and easier for people walking and cycling.



This may make more people want to walk and cycle rather than travel by car.



We are planning to create new cycling routes on Baddow Road, Van Diemans Road, Meadgate Avenue and Parkway.




We are also looking at possible routes from the Sandon Park and Ride and planned new Widford Park and Ride.





Walking and cycling

This map shows you where we are planning to make improvements for walking and cycling.



Key:



Sandon Park and Ride



A Park and Ride is a big car park where you can park your car and then take a bus for the rest of your journey.



This means you do not have to get stuck in traffic driving into the busy city centre.



It also helps to reduce the number of cars on roads in the city.



There are two Park and Rides in Chelmsford at the moment. One is called Sandon and the other is called Chelmer Valley.



We want to make Sandon Park and Ride bigger and better so more people can use it.



We are planning to create space for about 350 more cars.

Sandon Park and Ride



There will be 161 parking spaces for electric cars, 76 for disabled people and 49 for those with children.



The building where you will go to get on the bus will be moved to the middle of the site so everyone can reach it easily.



We will also make things better for people walking and cycling.

The construction work would take about nine months and we will make sure that the Park and Ride can stay open during this time.



We hope to do this before starting work at the Army and Navy junction so people have another way to travel into Chelmsford.



When the Park and Ride is made bigger we think it will be about three quarters full in 2041.

Widford Park and Ride

Widford

We also want to build a new Park and Ride in a place called Widford.



This is on the edge of Chelmsford near Writtle.



A new Park and Ride here would give people more choices about the way they travel into Chelmsford.



We are looking at two different places in Widford where a new Park and Ride could be built.



We have not decided which one would be best and would like your help to decide.

Widford Park and Ride



We could build on land next to the A414 London Road.

Here, there would be about 1,000 parking spaces.




This would include 103 parking spaces for electric cars, 42 for disabled people and 27 for those with children.



Again, the building where people go to get on the bus would be in the middle so everyone can reach it easily.



People would enter the Park and Ride from a new T-Junction on the A414 London Road.



We think it would be about three quarters full in 2026 and completely full in 2041.

Widford Park and Ride



The other place we could build a new Park and Ride in Widford is on land next to the A414 Greenbury Way.

Here we would have about 1,000 parking spaces and could add more in the future.



It would have 103 parking spaces for electric cars, 42 for disabled people and 27 for those with children.



Once more, the building where people go to get on the bus would be in the middle of the site.



People would enter the Park and Ride from a new roundabout on the A414 Greenbury Way.



We think it would be about three quarters full in 2026 and almost completely full in 2041.

Next steps




After you have told us what you think, we will use your views to help us make choices about the project and decide whether we need to change any parts of our plans.



We consider the costs and benefits of our plans, how easy they would be to build and any impacts they would have on the environment.



We want to improve the Army and Navy junction as quickly as we can, but we have to do things in a certain way and follow the law.



We currently think building work will start in Autumn 2024 and be finished in Autumn 2026.



This could be delayed if we are unable to buy the land needed quickly.
