6. Report on Schemes awaiting funding

Jon Simmons presented the report providing an update on the current position on the schemes recommended for inclusion in the 2020/21 programme.

The Panel reviewed the schemes taking into account that should a scheme be removed all the data behind it would be retained should the Panel wish to reinstate it. The Panel agreed that traffic surveys provided evidence that could be shared with residents when



requested. It was noted that Colchester had a high number of requests for speed surveys and that there was a need for balance particularly as going forward there will be a need for budget savings. A report/figures to be provided on traffic surveys commissioned in 2020/21 to aid considerations for the new financial year.
