The Essex County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 84(1) and (2), and Part III of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") (as amended), hereby make the following Order: -

- 1. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on those lengths of road, in the District of Tendring as specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 2. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.
- 3. This order shall come into operation on and may be cited as The Essex County Council (Various Roads, Kirby Cross) (20mph Zone) Order 202*.
