8 AOB:

Cllr Higgins raised concerns around advance signage for the changed traffic movements in Colchester town center when entering Headgate/ Head Street that access to Queen Street is no longer from High Street eastbound but needs to be from East Hill/ High Street in a westbound direction.

RM updated the panel on roughly £200,000 worth of schemes. These were schemes that the LHP had previously recommended for design however they were keen that the funding; now available followed the schemes.

Panel members requested that officers send round criteria/costings in order for schools to fund their own school crossing patrols
